uphold our conservative values of community engagement and responsibility, epitomizing the spirit of Utah, which is marked by dedication, moral integrity, family values, and community commitment.

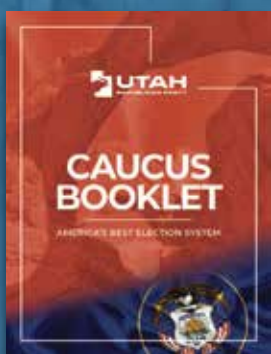
