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**A BILL**

To direct the head of the Department of Government Efficiency to submit a report to Congress on the personnel of the Department and present information to Congress on the activities carried out by the Department, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Legislative Enforce-  
5       ment Against Setbacks from Harmful DOGE Actions  
6       Act” or the “LEASH DOGE Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REQUIRING PROVISION OF INFORMATION ON EM-**  
2 **PLOYEES AND ACTIVITIES OF DEPARTMENT**  
3 **OF GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY.**

4 (a) REPORT.—The head of the United States DOGE  
5 Service (commonly referred to as the “Department of Gov-  
6 ernment Efficiency” or “DOGE”) shall submit a report  
7 to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform  
8 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on  
9 Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the Sen-  
10 ate containing the following information:

11 (1) A list of—

12 (A) all employees of the Department, in-  
13 cluding special Government employees, and a  
14 description of each employee’s role; and

15 (B) all employees of the Executive Office  
16 of the President, including any individual serv-  
17 ing as a Senior Advisor to the President, whose  
18 duties include advising the President on the op-  
19 erations of the Department.

20 (2) For each such employee, a statement of  
21 whether the employee has undergone a background  
22 check and, if so, the results of the background  
23 check.

24 (3) For each such employee, a statement of  
25 whether the employee has a security clearance.

1           (4) For each such employee, a statement dis-  
2           closing any conflict of interest held by the employee,  
3           including (if applicable) a description of a plan en-  
4           tered into by the employee to address such conflicts  
5           and the person with whom the employee entered into  
6           the plan.

7           (b) APPEARANCE AT MEETINGS OF COMMITTEES.—

8           (1) APPEARANCE OF HEAD OF DOGE RE-  
9           QUIRED.—The head of DOGE and any Senior Advi-  
10          sor to the President described in subsection  
11          (a)(1)(B) shall appear at a closed meeting of the  
12          Committee on Oversight and Government Reform of  
13          the House of Representatives and a closed meeting  
14          of the Committee on Homeland Security and Gov-  
15          ernmental Affairs of the Senate to present informa-  
16          tion on the activities carried out by the Department  
17          as of the date of the meeting and on the activities  
18          the Department intends to carry out after such date.

19          (2) INFORMATION ON ACCESS TO PERSONALLY  
20          IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION.—The head of DOGE  
21          and any Senior Advisor to the President described in  
22          subsection (a)(1)(B) shall include in the information  
23          presented at a meeting under this subsection a de-  
24          scription of the extent to which employees of DOGE  
25          have obtained access to computer systems of the

1 Federal Government, along with a description of the  
2 types of personally identifiable information contained  
3 in such systems for which such employees have ob-  
4 tained access.

5 (c) PUBLIC WEBSITE ON DOGE INFORMATION.—

6 (1) ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION.—The  
7 head of DOGE shall establish and operate a public  
8 website through which members of the public may  
9 obtain the following information in human-readable  
10 form:

11 (A) A list of employees of DOGE, include  
12 special Government employees, their titles, and  
13 a description of their role in DOGE.

14 (B) The number of employees laid off and  
15 put on administrative leave within each office of  
16 the Federal Government.

17 (C) A list of programs and activities within  
18 each office of the Government for which fund-  
19 ing has been reduced, and the amount by which  
20 such funding has been reduced.

21 (D) A list of programs and activities with-  
22 in each office of the Government for which  
23 funding has been paused, and a timeline on  
24 when a final decision will be made regarding  
25 that funding.

1 (E) A list of programs and activities within  
2 each office of the Government for which fund-  
3 ing has been eliminated.

4 (F) A list of individuals, including their  
5 contact information, whom Federal employees,  
6 recipients of Federal financial assistance, and  
7 members of the public may contact with ques-  
8 tions about the status of Federal personnel and  
9 Federal financial assistance.

10 (2) UPDATES.—The head of DOGE shall up-  
11 date the information provided on the website under  
12 this subsection not less frequently than once per  
13 week.

14 **SEC. 3. TREATMENT OF EMPLOYEES OF DOGE AGENCY**  
15 **TEAMS.**

16 (a) TREATMENT AS EMPLOYEE OF DOGE.—For  
17 purposes of this Act, an employee of an agency who serves  
18 on the DOGE Agency Team of the agency in accordance  
19 with section 3(c) of Executive Order 14158 shall be con-  
20 sidered an employee of DOGE.

21 (b) PROVISION OF INFORMATION.—The head of each  
22 agency for which a DOGE Agency Team has been estab-  
23 lished in accordance with such Executive Order shall pro-  
24 vide the head of DOGE with such information as may be

1 necessary for the head of DOGE to carry out the require-  
2 ments of this Act.

3 **SEC. 4. DEADLINES; RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF FUNDS.**

4 (a) DEADLINES.—Not later than March 31, 2025,  
5 the head of DOGE shall submit the report required under  
6 section 2(a), appear at meetings under section 2(b), and  
7 operate the public website under section 2(c).

8 (b) RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF FUNDS.—If the head  
9 of DOGE fails to comply with subsection (a)—

10 (1) any funds appropriated or otherwise made  
11 available for the Department of Government Effi-  
12 ciency, including amounts previously available for  
13 the United States Digital Service, may be used only  
14 to carry out activities initiated prior to January 20,  
15 2025; and

16 (2) no Federal funds may be used for any  
17 DOGE Agency Team established in accordance with  
18 section 3(c) of Executive Order 14158,  
19 until the head of DOGE submits the report required under  
20 section 2(a), appears at meetings under section 2(b), and  
21 operates the public website under section 2(c).
