GRILL FLAME

CLASSIFICATION GUIDE

SECTION A. ( ) GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS (U)

1. ( ) Purpose: To provide instructions and guidance on the classification of information in the Special Access Program for Project GRILL FLAME.

2. ( ) Authority: This guide is issued under the provisions of Chapter II, Section 4, DOD 5200.1R, dated December, 1978. This guide constitutes authority, and may be cited as the basis for classification, regrading, or declassification of information and materiel involved in Project GRILL FLAME. Classification required by application of this guide is classified by the Director, Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA).

4. ( ) Classification Recommendations: Recommendations for changes to this guide should be documented and forwarded through appropriate channels to DIA at the address indicated in paragraph 3, above. Possible reasons for modifying this guide include:

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Changes or progress obtained in the effort, scientific or technological changes in the state-of-the-art, or impractical requirements imposed by the guide. Until a final decision is issued by DIA, the items of information involved shall be protected at the higher of either the current classification or the recommended change. For recommended upgradings, use the marking, "TENTATIVE" followed by the appropriate classification. All users of this guide are encouraged to assist in improving and maintaining its currency and adequacy. Advances in the state-of-the-art which are not covered by this classification guide, and which offer possibilities of an increased national defense advantage, should be tentatively classified SECRET. This security classification guide is primarily concerned with DOD involvement in Remote Viewing, Psychokinesis, and other Psychoenergetic processes. The overall classification of the project is SECRET, classified by DIA, review on 1 May 1999, pursuant to the provisions of DOD 5200.1R, 2-301-C(5).

5. ( ) Application, Reproduction, and Dissemination: Authority is granted to make reproductions and extracts or selections of portions of this guide for application by specific groups involved in GRILL FLAME, including industrial activities, upon notification of the applicable Security Coordinator. Copies of separate guides issued to operating activities in application of this guide shall be sent to DIA. No information concerning this program will be

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approved for public release, even though unclassified, until it has been reviewed by the Security Coordinator, and forwarded to DIA for approval. Only DIA is authorized to release information to the public concerning this project, to include unclassified material.

1. ( ) Identification: (U)

a. The title, "GRILL FLAME," is unclassified.

b. The title, "Special Access Program for Psychoenergetics", is classified SECRET, GRILL FLAME.

c. The association of the title "GRILL FLAME" with "Special Access Program for Psychoenergetics" is classified SECRET, GRILL FLAME.

d. Any association of the title, "GRILL FLAME" with DOD, any individual DOD element, or any DOD contractor is unclassified.

e. Any association of the title, "Special Access Program for Psychoenergetics" with DOD, any individual DOD element, or any DOD contractor is classified SECRET, GRILL FLAME.

f. Any association of the titles, "GRILL FLAME" or "Special Access Program for Psychoenergetics" with Parapsychology, Remote Viewing, Paraphysical, Psychokinesis, or other terms which relate to the nature of this program is classified SECRET, GRILL FLAME.

2. ( ) Goal, Mission, Purpose: DOD's involvement in Psychoenergetics (to include Remote Viewing and Psychokinesis) with the objective to standardize the processes so that they may become

established tasks in the spectrum of intelligence and information gathering is classified SECRET, GRILL FLAME.

SECTION C. ( ) PERFORMANCE AND CAPABILITIES: (U)

1. ( ) The fact that DOD, or any DOD element, has contact with, or is associated in any official way with the Radio Physics Laboratory, SRI International, is classified SECRET, GRILL FLAME.

The identification of personnel of SRI International associated with this project is similarly classified.

2. ( ) The present or future association between and among DOD, or any DOD element, and any organization or individual who is involved in the study of Psychoenergetics is classified SECRET, GRILL FLAME.

2. ( ) The categories below correlate to a segregation of knowledge within the program.

- CATEGORY 1: GENERAL PROGRAM KNOWLEDGE:  
Includes supervision, procurement, budgeting, administration, and other support required.
- CATEGORY 2: OPERATIONAL KNOWLEDGE:  
Includes those individuals who must be cognizant of the general program goals, objectives, procedures, and results without direct participation.
- CATEGORY 3: INTELLIGENCE KNOWLEDGE:  
Includes techniques developed to acquire intelligence information. Also includes the assessment and application of intelligence related operations.
- CATEGORY 4: DETAILED KNOWLEDGE:  
Includes those personnel who are participants in the program and/or knowledge of all facets of the program to include identification of participants.

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
