CIA are considered necessary unless difficulty brises in connection with the administration or carrying out of the terms of the contract by the contractor.

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Review of technical progress reports and the work of the contractor will be worked out informally by the CIA liaison officer in accordance with arrangements previously established with representatives. All contractor's reports may be unclassified \mathcal{D} and can be handled by in accordance with their standard procedures, except that they will not be published or otherwise \mathcal{D} released for unclassified discontinuity nutside — until they have isen reviewed by the CIA lisispon officer.

It is believed that the procedures noted herein are compatible with the standard \sim procedures for handline unclassified projects and will not require a facility clearance or access to cleasified correspondence by the contractor. Cimilarly, the classified correspondence between and CLM is minimized to include only that which is essential to protect CLM accurity interests.
