A homosexual prostitution ring is under investigation by federal and District authorities and includes among its clients key officials of the Reagan and Bush administrations, military officers, congressional aides and U.S. and foreign business-men with close social ties to Wash-

In the 1970s, Mr. Dutcher was a congressional aide to former Rep. Robort Bauman, Maryland Republican, who resigned from the House after he admitted having engaged in sexual llaisons with teen-age male.


