SUBJECT:

1. The [REDACTED] papers were discussed at the ARTICHOKE conference, 16 July 1953, by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] apparently supports the ideas of [REDACTED] and the writer concerning a general conference between [REDACTED] officials and ourselves in the ARTICHOKE field.

2. [REDACTED] turned the documents in the case over to [REDACTED] TSS, for his study at this conference and [REDACTED] who was present representing the Medical Staff stated he also would like to examine the [REDACTED] papers.

3. The writer informed [REDACTED] that an extra photograph copy of the papers had been made and it would be possible to give these copies to others who are interested in reading the documents.

No definite date was set nor was there any final discussion as to what was to be done but it appears that [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] of OSI will get in contact with the [REDACTED] people using the letter drawn up by [REDACTED] or a similar letter and the usual activities will probably progress from that point.
